



<u>Absentee Bids:</u> Anyone wishing to bid who cannot attend the sale may place a phone or mail bid by contacting either ranch listed above. A letter of credit is required at least three days prior to sale date.

Registration and Transfers: All weanlings will sell with application for registration with AQHA. HQH foals will be registered with AQHA. HQH foals' papers will be mailed to the buyers once papers are received from AQHA. Transfers will be filled out sale day, so please remember to bring your AQHA membership ID number to the sale.

Terms and Conditions: Terms of this sale are cash, personal check, or cashier's check (US Funds). Driver's license or some other form of identification will be required for checks. The sale personnel will withhold registration papers for MRB horses until checks clear the bank. If any buyer wishes to obtain registration papers immediately, the horse must be paid for in currency or certified check. Every animal sells to the highest bidder with auctioneer, Seth Weishaar, settling any and all bid disputes. All horses are buyer's property as soon as the gavel drops. No delivery is available until final settlement is made on all purchases. Buyers must make arrangements for care of horses at their own risk until delivery is taken. Announced changes in the catalog information on sale day take precedence over printed material in this book. Every effort has been made to insure correctness of this catalog, but sellers assume no responsibility for errors or omissions. The auctioneer, announcer, employees, and sale management act as agents only for the sellers, but assume no liability for either the buyer or seller. The right to "NO SALE" the animal is reserved for all sellers, before they leave the sale ring.

<u>Health:</u> Health of these horses is excellent. Individual health papers with a Coggins test will be issued for shipment anywhere in the US. All Hetletved foals will be wormed, vaccinated, and handled. All Hetletved foals' halters will accompany the foals to their new owners. Every MRB horse in the sale is, to the best of our knowledge, free of disease or defect. Known defect(s) will be called on sale day. A veterinarian will be on hand to aide you in further inspection of your prospective purchases.

His progeny possess amazing maternal traits from rich milk to being self-sustaining in the pasture. In addition, High Rolling Roany's get offer size, cow ability, disposition, sound structure and mind, a will to work, and feet that will put farriers out of business.

The Hetletved Quarter Horse program offers the highest concentration of High Rolling Roany with the largest band of High Rolling Roany daughters (owning 60%). Better yet, our mares were hand-selected for their superior traits from Bub Nunn, a well-respected rancher and horseman spending his life in the Dakotas and Montana. These Roany descendents are known for their uniformity, maternal traits, and saddle-fitting withers for covering big country with good foot and bone. Hetletved Quarter Horses' Driftwood/Hancock stud battery includes a son and grandson of High Rolling Roany, a son of Drifts Chip, a son of Frostys War Chief by a High Rolling Roany Daughter, along with Zan Gold Jackson, a son of AQHA Heading and Heeling Champion Zan Gold Jack.

In an industry striving for consistency, we're your source for horses carrying a pedigree rich in Driftwood and Hancock. Our foals are a historical package of ancestry, full of athletic ability, cow sense, and sound foot and bone. Check out pages 4&5.



















California's Extreme Equine Experience...Dakota Style

On a quest to improve Hetletved Quarter Horse's Driftwood/Hancock breeding program, Gene Hetletved and his family continually research the industry's horses, crosses, and cutting edge equine issues. On one of these research journeys, Gene, through a mutual acquaintance, became aware of John Rudnick and his interest in Driftwood bred ranch horses. With his interest piqued, Gene called John Rudnick regarding his Driftwood horses. As the two horsemen visited about their passion, good horses, it was soon discussed about the possibility of Hetletved Quarter Horses furnishing the horses for the clinician competition during the 2006 Extreme Equine Experience in Paso Robles, California. John Rudnick wanted three horses that were closely related, and Gene had just the package—three-quarter sisters by Lonsum Drift 045 (an own son of Drifts Chip) and out of High Rolling Roany daughters. With both men finding the opportunities they were searching for, planning began.

On the Hetletved ranch, the travel plans and preparation commenced. The three-year old fillies were brought in for their spring vaccinations as well as Coggins samples drawn and health papers written. Gene and his wife, Jan, booked airline tickets. Gene and Jan's sons, Lee (Penny & Kinley) and Clint, packed their bags for the 1900 mile drive to California with the fillies on board.

Arriving two days early, the fillies had a chance to rest before Chris Cox, Ken McNabb, and Richard Winters began the round pen competition worth \$10,000. As the first day of competition arrived, each clinician drew for a round pen and a filly. Chris Cox drew pen one with Misty Prairie Drift, a gray filly. Richard Winters was chosen for pen two with Ms Drifting Roan, a blue roan filly. Ken McNabb found himself in pen three with Drifts Lonsum Chic, a brown filly.

After a mere hour and a half of allotted time, Chris Cox was riding his gray filly outside the round pen. Richard Winters was saddled and on board his blue roan filly. Ken McNabb didn't have his brown filly saddled, but he did have a solid foundation that would prove to be helpful the following day. The clinicians returned the next day with one more hour of work with each filly before the obstacle course as the competition's grand finale.

Both days' round pen time as well as the obstacle course were judged by some of the most knowledgeable professionals in the equine industry: Monty Roberts, Vivian Robertson, Pete Agalos, Gary Gordon, DVM, and Tommy Sondgroth. The obstacle course included the following requirements: mount and dismount from each side; walk, trot, canter; cross a log; step through garden hoses; and pull a log ten feet. The time limit was eight minutes with any remaining time to be used as each clinician saw fit.

The order was drawn for the obstacle course. Up first was Ken McNabb with Drifts Lonsum Chic. Ken had taken the audience on a tremendous journey the past two days as his brown filly had transformed into his trusting friend. Drifts Lonsum Chic, gently guided by Ken, traveled through the obstacle course with ease.

Chris Cox followed on top of Misty Prairie Drift. This grey filly followed each command that Cox gave her. As Cox finished all of the requirements of the obstacle course with two minutes remaining of the eight minutes given, he stood up on Misty Prairie Drift's back and gave the audience a sign to "hush." He then dismounted and walked away from the filly. As the crowd affirmed his performance, Misty Prairie Drift joined up with Chris Cox—completely in his back pocket.

Richard Winters was the last to go through the obstacle course on board Ms Drifting Roan. Midway through the course, the duo had difficulty communicating. Ms Drifting Roan used equine instincts of flight—Richard Winters easily halted these instincts and continued with the competition until time elapsed. (After our return, Richard Winters emailed: "It was great to see these nice horses who made such strong changes in the short time we had to work with them. I found these mares to be willing, intelligent, and nice to be around.")

The spotlight then turned to the judges' ballots. Maureen Rudnick, wife to John and event coordinator, then had the nerve-wracking task of figuring the scores as the eyes of the audience rested upon her. The winner of the \$10,000 and title of Champion of the Extreme Equine Experience went to Chris Cox, hailing from Australia. All clinicians had displayed methodology that worked. All fillies had displayed their willingness to learn—a common disposition of Hetletved Quarter Horses.

So, where are these fillies now? Despite buyers' offers in Paso Robles, these three-quarter sisters were hand-picked to enter the broodmare band. These mares are being crossed to High Driftin Hancock and have foals in sale as Lot # 2, 14, & 26.



On an additional note, following our experience in Paso Robles, we had the honor of Ken McNabb coming to our sale. He was impressed with our horses, and we were impressed with his integrity. He led us in Cowboy Church Services. If you've never had a chance to get to know Ken, we highly recommend tuning into one of his segments on RFD TV.





The Story Behind Our Breeding Program...

Hetletved Quarter Horses desired a breeding program that would produce horses possessing good dispositions, foot and bone, as well as reflecting proven foundational bloodlines within the ancestry. In addition to the physical features, we wanted horses with good minds, athletic ability, and diversity under saddle. Through much research and networking, Hetletved Quarter Horses chose the route they wanted to pursue. Our breeding program is based on three sires that possess profound consistency. These sires are Joe Hancock, Driftwood, and High Rolling Roany.

Joe Hancock was born in 1923 on the John Hancock Ranch in Texas. Joe Hancock sired six Race ROM, 2 Arena ROM, and 21 ROM Producing daughters. Joe was put down in 1943 due to complications from a pasture accident. He was inducted into the AQHA Hall of Fame in 1992.

Joe Hancock did not receive the above list of fame by being a mere sire. In those days, stallions had to prove themselves before getting stallion duties. Joe Hancock was known for his conformation. The Western Horsemen's <u>Legends</u> quoted Newt Keck as saying, "Joe could go to the track today and not be out of place in terms of conformation...He looked good then, and he'd still look good. Joe had the best hip and one of the heaviest loins [I'd] ever seen on a horse."

Joe Hancock raced during the true glory days on dirt roads and "lap and taps." Joe was never beaten in all his races at three-eighths of a mile. He was only beaten once in his career during a half mile race. During his off time, Joe Hancock was cowboyed on at the ranch as well as breeding

Diane Simmon's <u>Legends</u> book states, "Many ropers of today say that Joe Hancock was the all-time greatest sire of rope horses. Even third- and fourth-generation Hancocks have made good rope horses...Old time ropers say that the Hancocks were big, stout, and tough, with lots of bone...Most of them had good withers, cinched deep, and sure enough could run...Ropers still swear by these big...hard-working horses."

Driftwood, also known as "Speedy," was born on 1932 on the Childress Ranch in Texas. Driftwood had 25 foal crops before his death in 1960. We chose Driftwood breeding due to his consistency of offspring being great performers. AQHA calls him a "Legendary Sire of Roping Horses" in a 1952 article published by the organization. Driftwood is a grandsire of 16 AQHA Champions, a sire of 20 ROM earners, and is considered 100% Foundation Quarter Horse breeding.

None of the accolades are without merit, though, since Driftwood himself was quite a performer. He was known for outstanding physical ability and speed. Driftwood was a notorious lap and tap racer. His fame for this sport came not only from his speed index of 95 mph, but also due to his never getting "hot" with the many re-starts that were common to the sport. Driftwood was sold to Asbury Schell, a tough Calf Roper and World Champion Team Roper, who made Driftwood a fixture at the big rodeos across the circuit. Soon, Driftwood was known as "Speedy" due to his ability to catch cattle with ease. Driftwood was used in calf roping, team tying, single steer roping, bull dogging, and match races. According to a Hoofs and Horns article, Driftwood was used at a Payson, AZ rodeo where he took his riders to the pay window in all of the above events. Due to the hardships of World War II, Asbury sold Driftwood in 1943 to Channing and Katy Peake where he began his career as a sire.

Driftwood's diversity, ability, and disposition are characteristics still coming through his generations today. The Western Horsemen's <u>Legends: Volume II</u> quotes Jimmy Williams, one of the greatest stock horse and hunter-jumper trainers, as describing Driftwood foals by saying: "They are the best. You ask 'em to do anything, and they'll do it. They want to learn, and they have the ability to do something when you've finished with them. I think Speedy is as good a sire as there is any place."

High Rolling Roany is a Driftwood/Joe Hancock bred stallion. High Rolling Roany was born in 1985 on the Roy Cleveland Ranch. He was purchased as a yearling by Bub Nunn of Miles City, MT. High Rolling Roany died in 1998 due to complications of a foot injury while pasture breeding. Roany is buried on top of a hill that sees in all directions at the Hetletved Quarter Horse Ranch.

According to the article entitled "The Cowhorse Confluence" by John L. Moore, the purchase of High Rolling Roany happened like this. Nunn says he was "wanting a Hancock horse pretty bad" when he went to a Jayne Harris horse sale in Recluse, Wyoming in 1985. A stranger approached him and pointed at one big roan weanling. "That's the only stud colt ever saved out of Roan Prairie," the man said. "I picked up in Cheyenne on Roan Prairie and he was the best pickup horse I ever rode." The colt had been consigned to the sale by noted breeder Roy Cleveland and was named "High Rolling Roany." Just as Roan Prairie was the definition of quality by that stranger, High Rolling Roany proved to be a super saddle horse that covered the big country of Montana with ease. As a sire, he consistently gave his foals even dispositions, good foot and bone, as well as putting a "roan hide" on a majority of his foals.

High Rolling Roany proved to be much more, though, in our hearts. We were fortunate enough to be able to acquire a large band of High Rolling Roany daughters from Bub and Nona Nunn of Miles City, MT. These daughters had all of High Rolling Roany's traits in addition to phenomenal maternal traits—especially in milk production. By sale day in August, at only three to three and a half months old, many of our foals are already shed out and fat from their mama's milk. High Rolling Roany enveloped the greatness of Joe Hancock and Driftwood as well as offered more greatness within his own traits. Featuring Legends Joe Hancock, Driftwood, and High Rolling Roany...

All of Hetletved Quarter Horses' current ranch stallions (with the exception of Zan Gold Jackson) are descendants of Driftwood and Joe Hancock. It's with great pride that we offer our foals who have legendary ancestors, good conformation and bone, big hips, athletic ability, and good dispositions. Most of all, though, they have proven to have minds to handle any situation, pressure, and duty.



The following story segment, as well as the picture to the left with Bub and Nona Nunn, are courtesy of John L. Moore, author and Montana Rancher... "There is no lack of cow in Nunn's Roany horses. 'I saw something once I wouldn't have believed if I hadn't seen it with my own eyes,' says Nona Nunn, Bub's wife. 'Bub was working heifers in the corral on Roany, and two tried to get by him. One tried to go behind Roany, and he stuck his leg out to block it.' The Hancock line of horses have always been known for

being unusually athletic for their size... 'Nick Mothershead started Roany,' Nunn recalls. 'After the first saddling he called me. I thought you said that horse had never been rode,' he said. He hadn't, I told him.' On his first ride Roany had behaved like a broke horse."

Lonsum Drift 045 is a 1997 stallion that fits into our production operation nicely. He is well-dispositioned and owns an incredible pedigree. Drift rides out well...he is quick and handy under saddle.


Drift consistently produces top quality foals for our sale. He is a strong breeder that puts big hips on his foals along with good foot and bone. Several of Drift's colts are standing at stud. We also have young geldings of Drift's on several ranches, and the buyers are very pleased with them. They are smart, quick to learn, and easy to get along with.

Drifts Chip's first AQHA performers earned points in open reining and open heeling. Many of his foals are highly valued rodeo and ranch horses.

Lonsum Tiger was the 1979 NCHA Reserve World Champion Cutting Horse. Tiger Leo AAA has sired 24 Superior, 10 AQHA Champions, 4 World Champions, and 3 Reserve World Champions. Kiowas Diana, a triple bred King mare, is the dam of 3 AOHA Champions, and 592 AOHA Open Points. All of her performers are full brothers and sisters to Lonsum Tiger.


